

## Successful series of seminars in flooded Poland

During three days we performed three well attended seminars in Poland the 18<sup>th</sup>-20<sup>th</sup> of May. We started in Wroclaw, continued to Krakow and finished in Warsaw. The topic for these seminars was "Tall building construction".

All together we had more than 220 participants, who had the opportunity to listen to three very experienced speakers: Mr Chris Pal from the NORR Group in Dubai, Mr Vince Ugarow from Hilson Moran in London and Professor Edward Szczechowiak from the university in Poznan.

During the minibus transport from Wroclaw to Krakow we had a view of the flooding river Wisla, which also affected the number of participants in Krakow.

However more than 50 people appeared, which has to be regarded as a very good result under the current conditions.

## Lars Ekberg (pHD) – a speaker portrait

Lars Ekberg is an Associate Professor at Chalmers University of Technology in Gothenburg, Sweden and has since the late 1990s worked at Chalmers Institute of Technology Energy Management AB. He works on behalf of property managers as a specialist on issues related to indoor environmental quality and the functioning of the installations.

During 2005-2006, he was responsible for the revision of the Plumbing Technical Association's Guidelines for

Specification of current climate regulations. He has been engaged as an expert of the Swedish National Energy Authority in connection with technical guidelines regarding energy efficient air filters.

Besides having been engaged several times as a lecturer at numerous Swegon Air Academy seminars, Lars Ekberg also served as the technical and scientific editor of our first book "AIR", which was launched a couple of years ago.
